

FISE MONTPELLIER 2022 Exceptional attendance for the first two days of that 25th edition

While Paris has its eyes riveted on the tennis courts, Montpellier has been pulsating to the rhythm of urban sports since yesterday morning.

Exceptional attendance for the first two days of the 25th edition of the FISE with **no less than 226,000 people**, whether enthusiasts of these disciplines or holidaymakers in May, who strolled along the banks of the Lez where the event extends over a 1.2 km long area.

Nothing surprising for this event which is now ranked as the **3rd biggest among free sports events in France** (after the Tour de France and the Vendée Globe).

On Sunday, at the end of these 5 days, over 600,000 people will have passed through the doors of the festival.

And for good reason, as no other free event attracts this many different sports and this many athletes. Seven sports (including three Olympic disciplines) - BMX, Skateboard, Parkour, Roller, Scooter, Breaking, and Bike Life - nearly 2,000 professional and amateur athletes from 54 countries, and 60 competitions including five World Cups. The numbers are mind-boggling!

Yesterday, the kick-off was given with, among other sports events, the qualification round for the World Cup WS Roller Freestyle Park men, where two Frenchmen, Cudot and Diaby, came out in 2nd and 3rd place respectively.

Today, May 26th, the women competing in BMX Freestyle Park put on a breathtaking show during the qualifications for the UCI World Cup of the discipline.

This second day of FISE was also under the sign of Breaking, one of the most observed disciplines this week since it was just added to the Olympic calendar. The WDSF BREAKING FOR GOLD WORLD SERIES held during the FISE Montpellier will be the first opportunity for competitors to enter the race to qualify for the Paris Olympics in 2024.
